

DPA Audit Team

In January, Letterkenny hosted aerospace consultants who partnered with the Directorate of Product Assurance internal auditors to perform a depot-wide audit. This process-based internal audit was a team effort consisting of various DPA employees, including Shawn Waters, Chris Lord, Jeremy Bowerman, Gary Wease, Shawn Bloom and Deb Baldwin.

The collaborative effort intended to look at depot processes, from planning and execution to management, and ensure those processes complied with AS9100/9110 standards.

"The auditors examined everything from planning, execution, purchasing, tool control and FOD to verify corrective actions from past external audit findings, ensure ongoing compliance moving forward and identify areas where we can improve," said Joshua Hooper, quality assurance specialist supervisor.

With the help of the entire depot, the DPA team is working hard to ensure LEAD is prepared for the upcoming external audit to maintain certification of AS9100/9110 standards.

"The countdown has begun," said Hooper, "and the third-party external aerospace audit will be upon us in only six months. DPA depends on every Letterkenny team member to adhere to established processes and to constantly be attentive to how we can be postured for success!"
